

José M. Sanz received PhD degree (Dr. rer. Nat.) in 1982 from the Stuttgart University (Germany). He joined the Universidad Autónoma de Madrid in 1983 where he became Professor in 1992 at the Applied Physics Department. He was member of the Scientific Advisory Committee of the European Synchrotron Radiation Facility (ESRF) between 1999 and 2001, Chairman of ECASIA'99 and since 2001 he is the European Editor of Surface and Interface Analysis. His major interests are the synthesis of thin films, coatings (e.g. optical, hard, magnetic, etc.), nanostructures (e.g. CNT, SiNWs, etc.) and nanostructured materials as well as their characterization using electron spectroscopies and synchrotron based X-ray techniques.

José M. Sanz has been Rector of the Universidad Autónoma de Madrid since July 2009. He has been a member of the university's governing body since 2002 and has a wide experience in university management. As a scientist and experienced researcher, he is member of several national and international steering and review committees and panels, and since 2001 he is the European Editor of Surface and Interface Analysis. A renowned expert in materials science as well as in electron spectroscopies for surface and interface analysis, he has published more than 130 papers in a wide range of international peer-reviewed journals and has been responsible of numerous research projects.
